Please keep Savannah looking nice! Vehicles for commercial use with company name, commercial graphics or logo, etc. painted onto the body of the vehicle, all box trucks, any vehicle over ½ ton or any vehicle built up specifically for commercial use are not allowed to be parked on the streets. They must be kept in the driveway or the garage at all times. Violation letters will be issued to those who do not comply with this restriction. This includes parking during nights and weekends as well as during the day.

Be Cool to Your Pool

As we are all aware, the pool rules are established to ensure safety, health, and comfort for all pool users. Here are some highlights of some of the rules.



No glass containers in the pool yard at any time. Glass containers are easily broken on the walkways, pool, and pool surrounds.

Babies must wear specially designed swim diapers in order to be allowed in the pool. This is a health and sanitation issue. Human waste that escapes diapers contaminates the pool water and creates an unsanitary condition which forces the closure of the pool for at least 24 hours.

No eating, drinking, or smoking while in the pool water. Food, drinks, and cigarette ashes/butts pollute the pool water and create an unsanitary condition.

Children 12 years of age and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times. Children will be children and, when left unsupervised, can endanger themselves and others.

Slides are open between the hours of 12pm - 8pm. Lifeguards will be at the pool whenever the slide is open.

No running or rough play. Pool yards are full of slippery and hard surfaces. Running and rough play often lead to injuries in these conditions.

No abusive language, loud radios, or excessive noise. Purely out of courtesy for your neighbor.

No smoking except in designated areas. Just as with the carpet in your home, a dropped cigarette butt will leave unsightly damage to the turf.

No wet swimwear in Club Savannah. The floors and furniture in the Clubhouse are expensive and easily damaged by wet swimwear.

In addition to the above highlighted rules we would like to remind everyone to help keep the pools clean and filters

unclogged by making sure children shower off all sand clinging to them when moving from the sandbox to the pool.

Also as a reminder, the artificial turf gets hot in the summer so remember to bring some sort of foot wear with you to the pool this season.

Lifeguards and Savannah Management Staff have the right to remove those who refuse to follow the established rules. Parents or guardians will be responsible for ensuring their children are supervised while using the pool this season.

Drought Contingency Plans

As everyone knows, North Texas has been experiencing an unprecedented drought. Even though we have received some substantial showers lately, water levels are still significantly down in area reservoirs. Depending on weather conditions, the following drought contingency plan **MAY** go into effect. Refer to www.savannahca.com regularly for updates.



Stage 1 - Voluntary Water Conservation

- We ask that water customers voluntarily limit outdoor water usage by participating in a limited watering schedule. Outdoor water use should only occur every 5 days as designated by the District.
- Outdoor water use is discouraged between the hours of 10am - 7pm except with hand-held hoses equipped with a spray nozzle. Exception: New landscape installation during the first 10 days, the testing of new irrigation system or system under repair.

Stage 2 - Moderate Water Shortage

In the event of Stage 2 drought restrictions, those who violate the restrictions will be subject to fines.

- 5 Day Watering Schedule will be strictly enforced.
- Outdoor water use will be prohibited between 10am - 7pm.
- No washing of cars, boats, trailers or other vehicles except on designated days.
- No filling or refilling of swimming pools or Jacuzzis except on designated days. This use will be prohibited between 10am - 7pm.
- Operation of ornamental fountains or ponds is prohibited, except where such fountains or ponds are equipped with a recirculation system.

Wasting of water is prohibited. For example:

- Washing sidewalks, driveways or other outside areas.
- Allowing water to run off a property or accumulate as a pond in street.
- Washing any vehicle with a hose not equipped with a pistol grip spray nozzle.

**Please check sprinkler systems! Make sure you are not over-watering or spraying water onto pavement. If you have lost your sprinkler instructions, go to the manufacturer's website. If you would be interested in a class on how to adjust your system, contact Diana at 972-346-3020 or scamanager@savannahca.com.

Stage 3 - Severe Water Shortage

All requirements of Stage 2 remain in effect during Stage 3, with the following additions:

- **All** outdoor water use will only be permitted between 6am-10am & 7pm-10pm and only on days designated by the District.
- No washing of vehicles.
- No filling or refilling of pools.
- No new landscapes may be installed.

Water rationing would only occur if Stage 3 conditions persisted for an extended period of time. Please be aware that the entire community will be under the same restrictions. This includes public water usage. The pool, grotto and lake fountain, however, are examples of recirculated water systems.

We are all in this together. We regret the inconvenience, but with everyone's cooperation we will get through this dry weather cycle. **Hope for rain!**

Tips for Newly Planted Trees

Mulching

Mulching is the most important postplanting practice that you can do to improve the health and vitality of your tree. Mulching conserves moisture and insulates roots from heat and cold extremes. Proper mulching provides a well groomed appearance, eliminates grass or weed competition and prevents damage from mowers and weed trimmers.

Fertilizing for faster growth

Fertilize trees at planting time with a starter fertilizer high in phosphorus. Once established, fertilize your tree once a year with a slow release fertilizer at the drip line and beyond. The drip line is the area beneath the outermost branches. Feeder roots (the roots that take up water and nutrients) are present in this area and extend out even further. Fertilizing in this area is most beneficial for the plants.

Staking and guying

Staking and guying can provide additional support, anchorage or protection to large trees planted in open, windy sites. Avoid staking too rigidly allow the tree some movement. Remove stakes or guys after one growing season.

Watering

Your newly planted tree will require regular watering to supplement rainfall until its roots become established. We recommend checking the root ball for moisture by probing the soil in the root ball. Water no more than two or three times per week for a total of 1 inch. Operating 1725 Spanish Moss Way automatic lawn irrigation systems for 20 to 30 minutes per day often results in a continuously saturated soil condition, which in turn causes severe root damage and tree death.

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION

The Independence Day Celebration will be held on Saturday, July 1st this year. The highlight of this year's event will be a fantastic FIREWORKS SHOW as soon as it is dark. This will be a ground show from the Soccer Field and will be easily seen close-up from the pool area and all over the Savannah community.

Baseball/Softball – The committee will be recruiting for a Savannah adult softball team this spring to play Providence and Paloma Creek in an inter-community league.



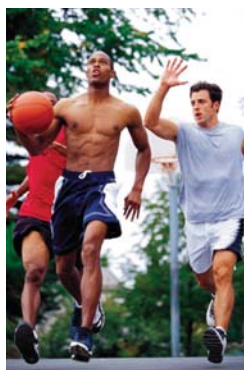
Basketball – activities will primarily be centered on scheduled pick up games in the pavilion and a tournament.

PRECINCT ONE MAYOR'S LUNCHEON A SUCCESS!

The Precinct One Mayor's Luncheon I hosted a few weeks ago was a rousing success! The primary purpose of bringing together all the Mayors within my Precinct is to discuss issues of mutual concern, and we were able to discuss several issues of mutual concern!

It is always productive to get mayors and city managers together. First, it just gives us all the opportunity to put a face with a name and personally meet each other. Second, it allows us all to network and talk about the issues we each face within our respective cities and see how we might glean wisdom from one another. And third, it provides the setting to be able to discuss the challenges we all face in dealing with the explosive growth in our areas.

I had invited the engineers from all the different cities to attend as well so they could participate in the discussion.

One of our topics revolved around the ETJ issues. A new law has been passed by the legislature (HB 1445) that requires one entity to oversee the platting process, and Denton County has Interpositional Agreements in place with most of the cities within Denton County to allow the city to fulfill that role. For the most part, cities believe it is working fairly well.

I emphasized the following points: 1) the ongoing need for the cities to inform Denton County of ETJ boundary changes; 2) the need for the cities to communicate to the county the development that is

occurring in the ETJ areas as we are still potentially responsible for the roads (if the road meets county criteria), drainage and storm water management requirements. I also highlighted all the transportation projects going on in my precinct and the status of each road project.

We were privileged to have State Representative Myra Crownover and representatives from State Senator Nelson, State Senator Estes, and Representative Solomons. It is always helpful for them to be able to hear what is going on in their areas as well, especially when it comes to development. They all expressed how much they enjoyed being able to hear directly from the Mayors on these important topics.
