If you ask most kids, summer went by way too fast. Here we are again- it's 'Back To School' time. Here is some information to help you and your kids get ready for the school year to begin on **August 28th**.

#### Savannah Elementary

School office will re-open August 6th, 8am-3pm. Registration at Savannah Elementary will be August 9-10 8am-3pm (none accepted before then). ALL STUDENTS MUST REGISTER. Returning students need proof of residency (utility bill dated within 30 days will do) and updated emergency contact information. New students will need: official birth certificate, social security card, complete and up to date immunization record, proof of residency and three emergency contacts including phone numbers.



Car tags will be available at registration. In order for you to pick your child up at the back driveway, you *must* have a car tag displayed on your rearview mirror. Be aware, Savannah students are not eligible to ride buses. Classroom assignments will be posted on the front doors of the school by 3:30pm on August 27. Tours and "Meet the Teacher" time will be 6-7pm. At that time, your child will be able to tour the building, meet his/her teacher and bring their school supplies to put in their classroom. Regular school attendance hours will be 8am-3pm.

#### Navo Middle School

Registration for 8th grade will be August 13, for 7th grade it will be August 14, and for 6th grade, August 15. Please bring proof of residency and emergency contact numbers. New students will also need official birth certificate and social security card, as well as complete and up to date immunization records. Regular school attendance hours will be 8:35am-3:35pm.



#### Denton High School

"Fast Passes" will be issued August 7-9. A Fast Pass is issued to expedite the schedule pick up process. To get a Fast Pass, just provide: proof of residency, immunization records, fines (if owed), and complete the required forms.



Schedule pickup will be coordinated by grade level and student's last name. Students should report during their assigned time to pickup their IDs, locker assignments, schedules, and textbooks. For students whose parents did not pick up a Fast Pass, please be certain to bring the required documentation/forms at the time of schedule pickup. Those dates for schedule pickup are: August 14- Seniors, August 15- Juniors, August 16- Sophomores and August 17- Freshmen.

New student enrollment will be August 22-24, 8-11am and 1-4pm each day. Denton HS invites to all new students and their parents to attend "FISH" camp on August 21 from 5:30-7:30pm. New students will be enrolled on a first come first serve basis. Please pick up a new student enrollment packet from the principal's office (available after July 16), have forms completed and all required documents available when registering your student. Dinner will be at 5:30, orientation at 6:30.

#### Ryan High School

Fast Pass registration packets will be available August 6-10t, 8am-3pm in the main office, except on Friday when the offices close at noon. Counselors will be available 8:30am-11:30am and 1pm-4pm by appointment only. The offices are closed from noon to 1pm for lunch. Schedule pickup dates are the same as Denton High.



Any student who fails to register and or pick-up their schedule at their assigned time, may come August 20-23rd from 1-3pm. Parking permits, schedules, ID cards, and textbooks can be picked up at that time. Any student who does not pick up textbooks during registration may not receive textbooks until the second week of school. Regular school attendance hours for both high schools are the same: 8:50am-3:50pm.

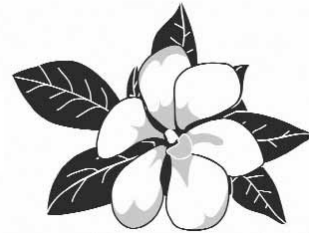

**HOA Dues**

The semi-annual dues (they were due April 1, 2007) are in the amount of \$357.50 (\$715 annually). Homeowners may pay their assessments by credit card. We accept Mastercard, Visa, Discover and American Express. Visit [www.SavannahCA.com](http://www.SavannahCA.com) and click on the image link that says "Pay Your Dues Online!" This link will take you to the Premier Communities website where you can follow the instructions to make your payment. You must have your coupon handy because you will need your account ID in order to take advantage of this service. The coupon is located at the bottom of your billing statement.

Please note: the bank may charge a convenience fee for this transaction.. If you have any questions, please contact Premier Communities at 866-424-8072.

**Do You Have Your Access Cards?**

To access the pool and fitness center you will need a valid magnetic access card (SCA dues must be up-to-date in order to be eligible). You should have received these cards when you first closed on your home. If you have lost or misplaced them, please contact the Association Manager at 972-346-3020 or scamanager@savannahca.com (\$25 charge for replacements).

If you are a new resident, we encourage you to attend the **New Homeowner Orientation at 11am each Saturday**. You will need to fill out some basic paper work and review Governing Documents (CCRs, Bylaws, etc). During your visit, you can sign up for your Access Cards and pool passes (if SCA dues have been paid).

Please bring either your:  
 a) current driver's license and closing papers, or...  
 b) your driver's license with Savannah address

Homeowner associations are formed for the purpose of preserving property values by providing for the harmony and beautification of your neighborhood through binding Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, also known as "CC&R's". These rules can be found in the "Declaration" section of your CC&R's. They are meant to benefit the community as a whole.

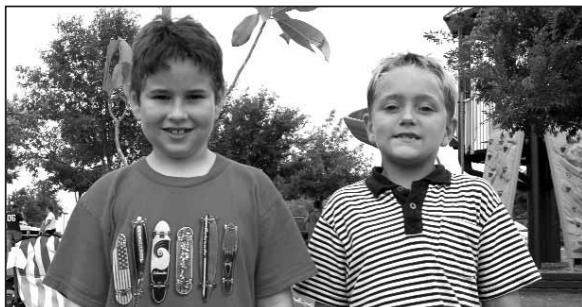
## Two Very Different Savannah Kids

## Special Tips To Eliminate Stains

**Gravy:** Spoon it up as right away, then sprinkle artificial sweetener or flour over the stain to absorb the grease. Put tablecloth into sink and soak in a mixture of one teaspoon of a mild, colorless detergent with each cup of lukewarm water for at least 20 minutes. Then wash as usual and let air dry (don't put in the dryer).

**Red Wine:** Pour a scoop of salt on top of the stain to absorb the liquid. Put the tablecloth into cold water and try to rub out the stain. Use an enzyme detergent in the hottest water safe for the fabric, soak for 30 minutes and then wash as usual.

**Ball-Point Ink:** Place stained garment on a towel stain-side down. Lightly dampen a cloth with rubbing alcohol and gently dab (do not rub) the stain.

**Kool-Aid on Kitchen Counter:** Sprinkle baking soda on a damp wash rag. Rub the stained area with the rag in a circular motion. Repeat if necessary. If stain is very stubborn, sprinkle baking soda directly 1109 Wisteria Lane on the stain, rub with damp rag.

## Things You Can Do To Stay Safe & Secure

A few reminders... be sure to leave your exterior lights on at every opportunity possible. Also, be sure when you are locking up your home at night that your vehicles are locked, your garage doors are closed, and ALL entry doors in to your home are locked... including the door entering from the garage!

## Denton County Deals With Flooding Issues

Rain events and flash flood warnings are anything but normal for Texas summers, yet here we are experiencing historic rainfall.

Like many areas throughout north Texas, Denton County has been critically impacted by the rains. Currently, several roads are closed due to the rising lake levels and each time it rains our Road and Bridge crews are on call so they can high-tail it out to usual culprits of high water crossing the road.

Additionally, with the kind of rain we have been getting they have to check other areas where we normally don't have water crossing the road, such as Shahan Prairie near Oak Point and Little Elm. Right now we have two roads that are under water and they are Shady Shores Road in the Lake Cities area and Fishtrap Road which runs just north of and par-

allel to Highway 380. Not only are these roads under water but they also had sustained serious damage before the water enveloped them and until the water recedes we will not be able to assess that damage.

In the month of June alone, Road and Bridge East crews have logged over 600 hours of overtime that is directly attributed to the rain. We are also experiencing increased calls on issues related to drainage and we are working hard to address those problems where we can. I say it that way for two reasons; labor and responsibility. Not only are we short staffed in our engineering department, but with the increased calls it is difficult to even assess the problems in our normal time frame which is typically 2 - 7 days. And when I say responsibility I am referring to the County's jurisdiction, which

is limited to the roads, ditches and culverts along the road.

Probably one of the most surprising issues we experience is people ignoring our barricades when we do have to close the road due to high water. There have been several instances where our crews have been involved in rescue efforts after someone drove around our barricades and got stuck in high water. So let me add my voice



to the others already out there and remind everyone that if you see a barricade across the road it is because it is dangerous beyond that point! Heed the new slogan: Turn Around, Don't Drown!

### Tollway Extension To Hwy 380

No other regional transportation project will have a more profound and positive affect on this community that the extension of the Tollway. North Texas Tollway Authority (NTTA) news is excellent regarding the status of the NTTA Phase 3 expansion from Highway 121 to Highway 380. Recent rains have not had as negative affect on construction as they could have because most of the heavy earth moving and bridge work has been completed to a point that the weather has not really slowed down progress.

This extension is approximately 9.6 miles long and will have 3 lanes in each direction, providing a major north-south artery toward Frisco, Plano, vital access to the George Bush Tollway for east-west travel and access to north Dallas.

According to a recent NTTA project update, "more than 80 percent of the roadway construction is complete, and toll plaza

construction is over halfway complete as well.

You can visit the NTTA website for the most current updates on the Phase 3 Extension at <http://www.ntta.org/AboutUs/Projects/DNTPhase3.htm>. Current estimated opening of the entire extension to traffic from Highway 380 southward to downtown is still scheduled for September 2007.

As a result of the much anticipated opening of the Phase 3 Extension, we are seeing a marked increase in the commercial property development along the 380 Corridor. Back in May, Denton County Commissioner Cynthia White organized a meeting of a new 380 Corridor Coalition to encourage entities along the corridor to begin addressing development concerns along the highway. The meeting was hosted by Huffines Communities at our Savannah clubhouse.
