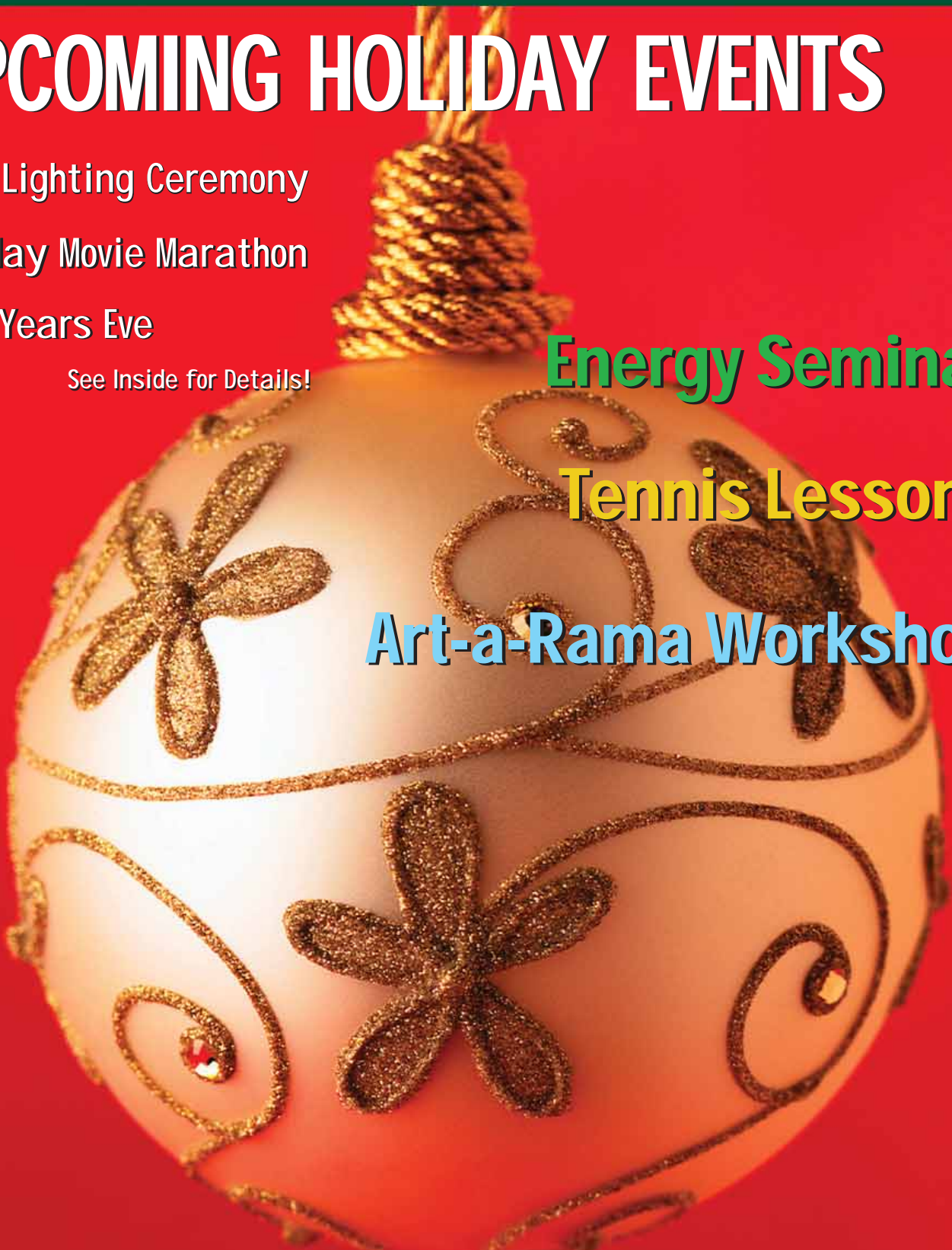

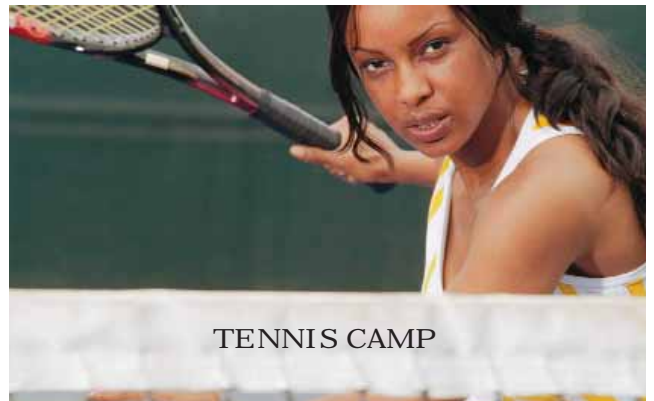

Safety Committee takes a leadership role in working with local law enforcement and organizing a crime-prevention network of block captains for every street in the neighborhood so that residents may watch out for one another. 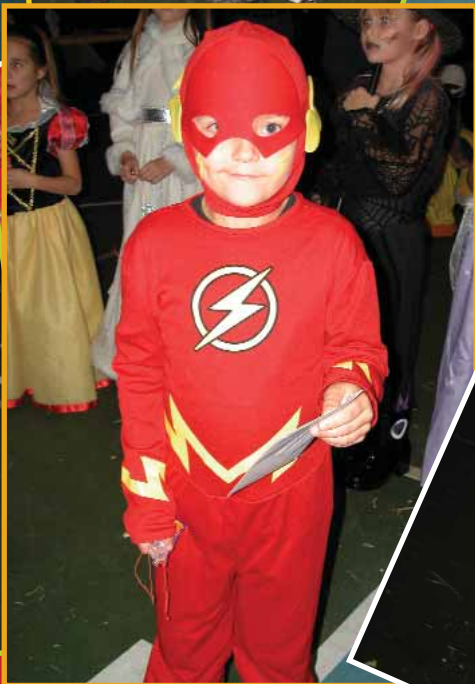
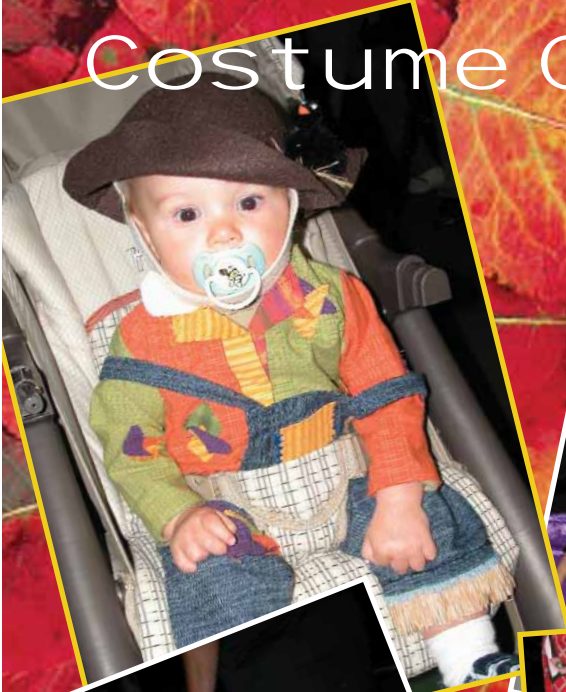

Two-Year Old Yard

Now that you have spent all year pulling weeds manually and spreading starter fertilizer, it is time to use various types of fertilizers on your second year lawn depending on month of the new year.

To begin the yard treatment and prepare the yard for the summer months, you should begin with a pre-emergent for the first time. The following is a plan to use for your second year lawn.

Jan-Mar Pre-emergent 0-0-7
Apr-May Pre-emergent with fertilizer 25-2-5
June-July Balanced fertilizer 28-3-10
Aug-Sept Balanced fertilizer 28-3-10
Oct - Nov Fall pre-emergent 0-0-7

The numbers on any fertilizer bag refer to the percentage of primary nutrients found inside. Primary nutrients are: nitrogen (N), phosphorous (P) and potassium (K). The first number represents the percentage of nitrogen. The second number indicates the percentage of phosphorous, and the last number, the percentage of potassium.

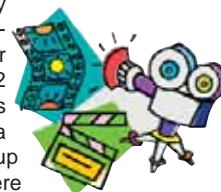

WE'RE LOOKING OUT FOR YOU!

We are in the process of reworking a number of social services that affect the residents of the Fresh Water Supply Districts along Highway 380.

One of the main contracts we are renegotiating is the police service contract. We have been meeting continuously with the new Sheriff to request more visibility in our community.

Officer Greg Hedges and Officer Robbie Allmon will have higher profiles within Savannah and will have a stronger presence at our functions and meetings.

They may attend the monthly board meetings, parties and events. They will be walking through the Clubhouse and pool complexes at night, so be fore-

warned that if you have that urge to run down to the pool at midnight and take a swim you might get more than you bargained for.

Being in the pool after pool hours is considered trespassing and will be prosecuted.

We are also working with the County Attorney to allow the officers to enforce more restrictions within Savannah, such as speeding and fireworks.

In an effort to help the officers make more efficient use of their time, we are asking for the help of the residents. For a six month period from April 1, 2005, through September 30, 2005, the officers responded to 227 alarms. Of the 227, there were 204 audible, 4

silent, 4 hold-up and 15 panic alarms. 99% were false alarms which still required the officers to respond.

The majority of the false alarms occurred during the day or early evening when people were returning from work and they forgot that their alarms had been set.

One false alarm is not a problem, but when the officers have to respond to such a large number, it takes time away from the officers to respond to actual emergencies.

One of those emergencies might just be yours. Please be aware of your alarms, and if you unintentionally set one off, make sure you call the monitoring company immediately to cancel. It would be a big help!

AIR QUALITY IS REALLY GETTING CLEANER

This is a volatile issue, to be sure. So what are the facts? Is our air getting worse or better? What's a SIP? What does non-attainment mean and how does it impact transportation?

These are all great questions and represent questions that I get asked fairly often. This is a complex issue. My goal will be to try and simplify the issue. Please check out the North Central Texas Council of Government's (NCTCOG) website at www.dfwinfo.com for detailed information.

The federal government passed legislation (Clean Air Act) that set the standard to be met by states and counties (meeting this standard means that you have attained the goal). The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is the agency charged with implementing this law. They are given the authority to write the rules for legislation that falls under their jurisdiction, including the Clean Air Act. The EPA codified the standard. That standard, the 1-Hour

Standard, says that attainment is reached when there are no more than three exceedances (exceedance is defined as being over the limit set by federal statute) per monitor within a consecutive three-year period. Historical data demonstrates that from 1986 to 2003 our area went from a high of 15 exceedances per year down to three exceedances per year. Air quality experts from our area were projecting we were within a couple of years of meeting the 1-Hour Standard.

Then the EPA changed the standard or the goal to an 8-Hour Standard and made it much more difficult to meet. In fact, at the time the goal was set at 9 ppm (parts per million) and there were 150 counties affected. In other words, 150 counties had been identified as non-attainment and were thus required to meet the 1-Hour Standard. The EPA took administrative action and changed the rule and set the goal at 8 ppm. This stroke of the administrator's pen that lowered the goal from 9 ppm to 8 ppm added another 150 counties to non-attainment status and increased the

requirements on those existing 150 counties, many of which were on the brink of meeting the original 1-Hour standard.

Data shows that our air has gotten much cleaner over the last several years in spite of the fact that the population in our area has increased. In Denton County alone our population went from approximately 260,000 thousand in 1990 to approximately 552,000 in 2005. In 1990 our region was emitting over 300 tons of VOC (Volatile Organic Compound) per day. Compare that to the latest figures that show we are emitting approximately 153 tons per day!

In my next column I will discuss the SIP (State Implementation Plan) and air quality's impact on transportation.
