In an effort to keep Savannah residents informed, Ms. Lehto will submit the minutes to the Water District Board meetings for posting on the Savannah Community Association website.

The meetings are open to the public and are held the third Thursday of each month at 5pm at the Prairie House Restaurant.

Community Association Dues Change

Effective April 1, 2007, it will be necessary to increase the Savannah HOA annual assessment from \$650 to \$715, an increase of \$1.25 a week. This increase is regrettable, but increased costs, which are mainly outside our scope of control, are driving up the cost of doing business and maintaining facilities. Electricity costs alone continue to climb at an annual rate of 20% to 30% and fuel surcharges continue to rise due to the increase in the price of oil.

We should note that this is the first increase in the annual assessment in three years and represents our continued commitment to keep our expenses in line with revenues. The increase closely matches the rate of inflation over the same time period. Huffines Communities will continue to improve the quality of life in Savannah with the addition of landscaping and park facilities for the enjoyment and use by all residents.

School's Out... Watch For Children When You Drive

Now that school is out, don't forget to watch out for our youngest residents as you drive through the neighborhood. It is an unfortunate fact that although kids should be careful and look out for cars, they will often forget. Drive slowly and always be vigilant.

Parents- now is a good time to review lessons in traffic safety. Remind children that the streets are primarily for cars, to always look both ways before crossing and that they should not dash out into the street from between parked cars.

UPDATE: LEWISVILLE LAKE BRIDGE/FM 720 PROJECT

The Lewisville Lake Bridge/FM 720 project just keeps getting closer to reality every day! And it never ceases to amaze me how many calls I get on this project! For a refresher, let's look at an overview of the project.

Denton County is the lead partner in this project that demonstrates more gets done with collaborative efforts! The Lewisville Lake Bridge/FM 720 project has been ongoing for over 10 years and involves partnerships with TXDOT, The North Texas Tollway Authority, Lake Dallas, the Town of Little Elm, Frisco and a developer! The citizens of Denton County first authorized the expenditure of county funds for the advanced planning of the project in 1991. When I took office in 2001 this project became one of my top priorities. While the project has metamorphosed several times over the years, the final project essentially falls into eight sections with Denton County overseeing the entire project.

Section 1: Swisher Road in the Lake Cities area

from 1-35E over to Lewisville Lake. Denton County is responsible for funding this section.

Section 2: Bridge over Lake Lewisville. There will be a toll booth on the west side of the lake only. The North Texas Tollway Authority is responsible for funding the bridge.

Section 3: The Bridge hits land at Harbor Lane on the Little Elm side of the lake and continues on Garza to FM 720. Denton County is responsible for funding.

Sections 4-6: Includes the intersection (which will be re-aligned with FM 720 North from Hwy. 380 with a T-intersection) and existing FM 720 through Little Elm. This is primarily the responsibility of TXDOT though there are several million dollars of Denton County bond funds on this portion as well.

Section 7: This is the section that veers north to FM 423. The developer built this section.

Section 8: Existing FM 2934 (Eldorado Parkway). TXDOT, Denton County and Frisco are responsible for funding.

The short version of the status is that Denton County is finalizing right-of-way issues on Sections 1 & 3 and we hope to go out to bid to construct those sections in the first quarter of 2006. NTTA expects to start construction of the bridge in mid 2006 and the entire project is still expected to be completed by the end of 2008 or first part of 2009.

It is exciting to see a project of this magnitude get closer and closer to construction and of course, the rewarding part will be to see it open, and easing congestion we face in Denton County and contributing to the regional mobility our area so desperately needs!

Do We Need A Turning Lane Off Of Hwy 380?

Some residents have expressed concern that there is not a "turning lane" at the entrance to the community off of 380. To decelerate and make the turn, people typically use the improved shoulder. A popularly held misconception is that this is an illegal maneuver.

Quite to the contrary- to quote Trooper Tilton with the DPS Office in McKinney (the DPS that patrols this area), "It is absolutely NOT against the law to make a right turn from an improved hard surface. In fact," he went on to say, "if someone made a right hand turn from the outer traffic lane on 380, and someone rear ended

them, they would be ticketed for causing the accident for having NOT used the shoulder as a safe turning option."

Texas law states:
Sec. 545.058. DRIVING ON IMPROVED SHOULDER.

(a) An operator may drive on an improved shoulder to the right of the main traveled portion of a roadway if that operation is necessary and may be done safely, but only:

- (1) to stop, stand, or park;
- (2) to accelerate before entering the main traveled lane of traffic;
- (3) to decelerate before making a right turn;

(4) to pass another vehicle that is slowing or stopped on the main traveled portion of the highway, disabled, or preparing to make a left turn;

(5) to allow another vehicle traveling faster to pass;

(6) as permitted or required by an official traffic-control device

(7) to avoid a collision.

While laws on this do vary in other states, this is allowed and actually the rule of the road in Texas! While a turning lane may very well be added at a later date, this information will hopefully put minds at ease.
